Qualifications: A Master or Bachelor of Social Work with at least six months' directly related experience assessing, advocating, planning and / or supporting vulnerable children and families is required. Experience working with or knowledge of Indigenous cultures. Experience working within a socially inclusive environment will be considered an asset. Experience with Child Intervention Services is an asset.

The following equivalencies may also be considered: a related university degree with two years of related experience; or a related diploma plus three years of related experience.

The ideal candidate will have a working knowledge of the Child, Youth, and Family Enhancement Act; possess excellent verbal and written communication skills and strong critical thinking skills.

The ideal candidate will demonstrate the following key competencies:

- Child Intervention (CI) Practice- This is legislated and is the foundational competency that is anchored by all six Child Intervention Practice Foundational principles: Aboriginal Experience; Preserve Family; Strengths-based; Connection; Collaboration; and Continuous Improvement.
- Anti-oppressive practice. Our Caseworkers understand how power operates in society, and seek to reduce or eliminate discrimination, by working respectfully with all individuals and groups fairly.
- Demonstrated Relationship Building skills- GOA Caseworkers are able to establish, sustain and foster constructive working relationships, focused on achieving positive CI outcomes, with children, families, communities and their work team.
